

# **Framing Guidelines**

## **General Guidelines**

#### Framing Standards:

• All entries must be framed or mounted to a professional standard, suitable for exhibition.

#### Frame Size:

• Maximum Framed or mounted the maximum external dimensions are set out in detail in the Conditions of Entry.

#### Labelling:

- Attach a label on the top right-hand corner of the back of each painting [Refer to illustration 1].
- Every label should show the artist's initials (AB) and a number (2 representing second painting the artist has entered into the exhibit): for example, AB-2 as shown in illustration 1. *Illustration 1:*

## Framing Instructions for: Framed Works Under Glass

- 1. **Materials**: All materials in contact with the artwork must be acid-free (e.g., mat, hinging tape, backing board). This is to prevent yellowing of the artwork.
- 2. **Covering:** Only Glass is acceptable to cover the painting. Perspex and plastic are NOT acceptable.
- 3. **Mounting**: The painting should be hinged to the mat or backing board at the top ONLY using two or three small pieces of acid-free hinging tape. This allows the painting to expand. **Do Not** fix around the entire periphery. **Do Not** use masking tape.
- Backing Board: Recommended backing board materials include foam core or core flute. Do Not use Masonite.
- 5. Float Mounting: Mounting the painting without mats under glass is acceptable, provided acid-free materials are used and a spacer is employed to separate the painting from the glass.
- 6. Securing the Frame: Use metal points to secure the glass, mat, painting, and backing board within the frame. Insert these with a Point Driver tool to ensure they are held firmly. The Society has a manual one that can be accessed/borrowed during Casual Painting mornings.
- 7. **Sealing**: Seal the frame on all sides with backing tape (**not** masking tape) to prevent dust and insects from entering.
- 8. **Hanging:** Attach a hanging cord or wire using metal D rings, placed one-third from the top of the frame. Ensure there is suitable slack for optimal hanging. Adhere a felt dot to bottom corners to stop painting from scratching the surface it is hung on.

## Framing Instructions for: Framed Works Not Under Glass

- 1. **Materials**: All materials in contact with the artwork must be acid-free. This is to prevent yellowing of the artwork.
- 2. **Covering:** Artwork surface must be covered/finished so that the watercolour surface is not exposed. This can be finished with coatings of varnish or wax.
- 3. Canvas: Stretched Canvas or Stretched Paper must be thick-edged.
- 4. **Mounting boards:** Cradle boards or similar, must be primed so that the timber stain cannot bleed through to the mounted artwork.
- 5. **Hanging:** Attach a hanging cord or wire using metal D rings, placed one-third from the top of the frame. Ensure there is suitable slack for optimal hanging. Adhere a felt dot to bottom corners to stop painting from scratching the surface it is hung on.
- 6. Ensure there aren't any protruding staples or other hardware.

### Framing Instructions for: Matted/Unframed Works

- 1. **Materials**: All materials in contact with the artwork must be acid-free. This is to prevent yellowing of the artwork.
- Matboard: Artwork must be mounted with single or double mat in professional grade <u>acid-</u> <u>free</u> matboard, not paper.
- 3. **Mat width**: The width of the mat should be in keeping with the size of the painting, e.g., a very large painting would not look balanced with a very narrow mat. It is inappropriate to use a landscape matboard for a portrait format or vice versa. It is acceptable to have the mat wider at the bottom
- Mounting: The painting should be hinged to the mat or backing board at the top ONLY using two or three small pieces of acid-free hinging tape. This allows the painting to expand. Do Not fix around the entire periphery. Do Not use masking tape.
- 5. **Backing Board:** Recommended backing board materials is acid-free foamboard. These come in 3mm and 5mm thicknesses. Matboard is not acceptable for this purpose.
- 6. **Covering:** The work must then be protected from handling and sealed in a clear cellophane sleeve or shrink-wrapped.
